## Bloom's Taxonomy Applied to Vocabulary Lesson

Level 1: Remembering- Students recall key information, such as the meaning of a word.

Example activity: Fill in the chart categorizing the vocabulary words.

Example activity: You will play a guessing game with another group. Read your definitions to the other group. They will guess what word you are describing.

*Ex*: This is a container that converts chemical energy to electricity. It powers the scooter. Answer: A battery



Example activity: Work with your group members to draw a flow chart to show the critical stages of using a scooter.

Ex: Step 1: First you need to place your finger on the scanner to activate the scooter.



Level 5: Evaluating- Students make accurate assessments or judgments about different concepts (Ex: find effective solutions to problems and justify conclusions).

Example activity: Ask students to evaluate the steps presented by other groups.

Ex: Group 1 suggested the third step is to check the brakes. We believe the third step should be to ensure the battery is charged.

## Level 6: Creating- Students demonstrate what they have learned by creating or resolving.

Example activity: Ask students to solve common customer service issues presented with the vocabulary learned in the lesson.
